*What did we learn, and what has emerged surrounding this grant?*

**Section A: Conclusions and Next Steps**

- A group of non-profit organizations participating in the discussion agreed that competing for a CTG focused on Capacity Building in Franklin County is a good place to start towards building a five year plan to impact the five CTG areas:

1. **Tobacco Free Living\*\***
2. **Active Living and Healthy Eating\*\***
3. **High Impact Quality Clinical and Other Preventive Services\*\***
4. **Social and Emotional Wellness**
5. **Healthy and Safe Physical**

**(\*\*You must address, and utilize a minimum of 50% of resources provided from CTG on the first 3 strategic direction items. Numbers 4 and 5 are optional. )**

- Franklin County Public Health volunteered to be the lead organization to compile and submit the CTG LOI by Monday, June 6<sup>th</sup> on behalf of the collaborative strategies identified at today's session.
- Representatives from Columbus Public Health and The Ohio State University offered to participate in a steering committee to guide the CTG grant opportunity moving forward
- Representatives from local non-profit organizations shared an interest in collaborating with others.
- Health Commissioner Tilgner asked Access HealthColumbus to host a planning session for the steering committee to develop a plan to create the CTG application due by July 15 (plan will also need to identify sources of technical assistance required to support the grant application process)
- Access HealthColumbus will compile a record of today's session and distribute to participating organizations for sharing with others.
